- 93.3% of pupils achieved Level4 + in English which is higher than the LA average (85.4%) and higher than the national figure (85%)
- 93.3% of pupils achieved Level4 + in Writing which is higher than the LA average (82.6%) and higher than the national (77%) - this percentage is taken from the 10% of schools nationally that were asked to submit their papers for external marking to provide a National sample for the Department for Education.
- 86.7% of pupils achieved Level4 + in Reading which is higher than the LA average (85.2%) and the same as national (87%)
- 93.3% of pupils achieved Level4 + in Maths which is higher than the LA average (83.3%) and higher than the National figure of 84%
- 86.7% of pupils achieved Level4 + in English/Maths combined which is higher than the LA average (78.6%) and higher than the national (80%)

- 66.7% of the cohort achieved L5 in both English and Maths (National 27%)
- 80% achieved L5 in Reading (National 48%)
- 66.7% in Writing. (National 35%)
- 73.3% achieved L5 in English (National 44%)
- 66.7% in Maths (National 39%).

- This year 14% of the cohort were teacher assessed as achieving Level 6 in Writing and Mathematics

### **Expected progress**

KS2 children are expected to make 2 levels progress from KS1 to KS2

100% of the cohort made the expected progress in Writing, Mathematics and English overall (2011- 100%)

93% made the expected progress in Reading based on the tests, 100% gained at least 2 levels progress based on teacher assessment. (2011-100%)
