Car Parking

I would like to remind everyone of the procedure for parking in the layby, as considerable congestion is caused when parents park their cars in the drop off lane.

As previously stated, the lane nearest to the main road (with the shrub border), together with the middle lane, are for staff and visitor parking. The lane nearest to the pavement is allocated for parents to drive through, drop their children off without getting out of the car and then proceeding on. If parents have very young children in baby carriers, etc., then it is possible for them to park in the middle lane.

For all other parents who wish to park their car and come down into the playground, parking is available at the sports hall. Parents are becoming increasingly frustrated that these rules are not being adhered to and, therefore, traffic does not flow freely.

Roving Reporters

Ancient Britain Day - Friday 11th November

On Friday 11th November, Class 3 had their 'Ancient Britain Day'. We all dressed up as someone from the Stone, Bronze or Iron Age. Dave from Murton Park came into school. We came up with the name Ash-Spear for him. Our tribe name was the wolf tribe and Ash-Spear was our leader. He explained that 'lithic' means Stone Age and 'neo' means new. Put it together and you get Neolithic - new Stone Age! The same with Mesolithic (middle) and Palaeolithic (old).

We got to hold artefacts that were thousands of years old and even got to build a Stone Age tent in our classroom!

At the end of our session, Ash-Spear told us a creepy true story. It was about a Neolithic man who was killed in the Alps over 5,000 years ago. When he was found, people called him Otzi, after the glacier he was found on. When he died, he was 45 (which was very old for a Stone Age man!) A man had sneakily followed Otzi up the mountain and when Otzi was bending down to light his fire, the other person shot him in the back with a flint arrow. We know everything about him except who shot him and why... We enjoyed trying to solve the mystery and did some story writing on Monday about what we thought might have happened.
