# Year 6 SATs

We hope that you will help us to support your child through next week to ensure that it is a positive experience for them and gives them every opportunity to do their very best and fulfil their potential. You can help your child in the following

- Ensure your child gets plenty of rest and sleep the night before SATs week and throughout the week.
- Make sure your child eats a suitable breakfast each morning. It is important that all pupils feel comfortable and relaxed when taking the tests.
- Ensure your child attends school each day during the SATs week and is at school on time: the tests start promptly after 9am. Children should not be kept at home for minor illnesses such as colds. Every effort needs to be made to ensure all children attend school this week.
- Encourage your child to appreciate the seriousness of these tests. Remind them that you, like us, expect them to do their very best...
- ...but do make sure your child does not worry about them! Yes - they are important tests! Yes - they DO need to do their very best in them - but their best is good enough for us! No - they aren't worth losing sleep over or getting upset about!
- Encourage your child to have fun and be what they are at the end of the day: children. We do not find it beneficial to cram in revision work the weekend before the tests. Our pupils need to remember that they are very well prepared...
