

The Rainforest

Read the book 'Monkey puzzle'

After reading the 'Monkey Puzzle', talk about the different animals in the book. Do we see those animals around the area in which we live? Draw a picture of their favourite animal from the story. Write a short sentence to accompany your picture.



Look at photos of different members of your family. Do you look like anyone in your family? What are the similarities and what are the differences? Make a book 'My Family'. You could draw a family member a day and write a sentence about them.



Make a rainmaker using a tube and rice. Please do not use it Monday-Friday as we need



dry days.

Make a stone snake by painting stones? You could write numbers on the stones and put them in order. Someone could remove a stone and you have to figure out what number is missing.\



Make a parrot by cutting a circle in half



Make a repeating pattern snake



Make a salt dough/playdough snake, leave it to



dry then paint it.

You could make snakes of different lengths and compare the size.

Go on a walk, look out for pinecones. You could make a collection of pinecone snakes leaving them near where you found the pinecones for people to find. What could you use for its eyes and tongue? Will you make them straight or curled up in a spiral?
