### Assessments 2020/2021

At the current time, the indication is that statutory assessments for this academic year will be going ahead as planned. This includes Year 1 phonics test, Year 2 SATs tests, Year 4 multiplication tables check and Year 6 SATs tests. Children in Year 2 are also required to complete a phonics check after half term. Thanks to Mrs Dobson who has bravely offered to record a virtual phonics session for Year 1 parents which will be sent to you via email next week.

### Reminder: Open Sessions – Reception September 2021

You may have seen that we have advertised open sessions for children due to start school in September 2021. These will be taking place on **Saturday 31 October (10am – 2pm)** and **Wednesday 4 November (4pm – 5:30pm)** and provide an opportunity for families to meet myself and Mrs Helfferich and have a tour of school. Due to Covid restrictions, these will be conducted out of normal school hours in groups of no more than 6. These are primarily aimed at families who do not currently have older siblings in school.

### GOAL After School Club

After half term, we are looking to gradually reintroduce a very small number of after school clubs. These will be carried out by Mr Montgomery on a **Tuesday** with children in **Class 3** and on a **Friday** with children in **Class 4**. This prevents children from different bubbles mixing. The sessions will run in the hall from 3:30pm – 4:30pm on both nights, with a charge of £3 per session (£18 total) payable via ParentPay. We know that the Game of Actual Life is really popular with children across school and we hope that this after school opportunity will prove popular. We are obviously aware that Covid cases are on the increase again and thought that you might find the summaries on the following two pages useful. Whilst we are in North Yorkshire and therefore currently at “medium” risk, we are also highly aware of our proximity to York which has been elevated to “high” risk as of this weekend.

Whilst there is media speculation about school closures and an extended half term, nothing has been confirmed to this effect so we still anticipate children being in school next week as usual. A reminder that school will be closed next Friday, 23 October, for staff training. This means that the half term break begins for children on **Thursday 22 October**. School will reopen on **Monday 2 November**. At this stage we envisage that we will be continuing with our staggered start and end of the day systems and we will update you if there are any changes to this.

<b>Healthcare Services</b>	Open.
<b>Residential Care</b>	Open to external visitors with additional precautions, subject to individual care provider guidance.
<b>Travel and Transport</b>	No travel restrictions within area. Avoid travel into Local COVID Alert Level Very High areas where possible.
<b>Sporting Activity</b>	Organised sport / licensed physical activity allowed in outdoor settings. Indoor organised sport must follow social contact rules (other than youth or disabled sport).
<b>Worship</b>	Open, subject to social contact rules.
<b>Childcare</b>	Registered and wraparound childcare open. Supervised activities permitted in private homes. Children's groups permitted.
<b>Youth Clubs and Activities</b>	Permitted.

**There are three simple actions we must all do to keep on protecting each other:**

- Wash hands** keep washing your hands regularly
- Cover face** wear a face covering in enclosed spaces
- Make space** stay at least 2 metres apart - or 1 metre with a face covering or other precautions
